## The Upper Room

The heat was overwhelming. Salty rivulets had given way to ragging rapids as sweat soaked shirts became cooling cloths and any breeze was received with great joy. The room designed for ten, held forty who had arrived many hours before the solar heat had awakened.

Seated on the tile floors with backs to the walls, these valiant souls risked months of imprisonment to be taught the Word of God. Traveling hundreds of miles, they had gathered because a teacher had come from the other side of the world. He had, they had been told, been arrested in seven countries for preaching Christ. And, like them, he had refused to concede the battle, but continued to travel the nations sharing his faith. Several motor bikes rattled at the rear gate and then sped off. The foreigner entered the room none the worse for his hour ride through the awakening streets. Bible in hand, he took his place among them. He told a few stories and jokes to get the translator accustomed to his voice and then launched into what would be an eight-hour training on the ministry of the Holy Spirit.

Retrieving well-worn Bibles from backpacks and travel bags, they settled in with the book of Acts. From a human perspective, this is the narrative of the Acts of the Apostles; however, a more apt name would be the Acts of the Holy Spirit through the Apostles. Before the outpouring of the Holy Spirit – the Promise of God – the little band of believers clung fearfully to each other. After the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, they turned the world upside down. Acts begins with an intro from Luke to his sponsor. Yes, they were donor driven even in those early days. Money did not just fall from the sky to meet their needs.

“The former report that I sent to you, Theopholis, about all that Jesus did and taught...”

Eager eyes searched the sweat-soaked face of the teacher. What had caused him to pause in the first sentence? What could there be in this common greeting? Why did they suddenly feel a special witness of the Holy Spirit as the man paused? “Did and taught.” The teacher spoke and the translator communicated. “Did and taught, what Jesus did and taught.” The teacher scanned the room to see who in the group had grasped the truth. “Is it different in Vietnamese?” He asked the translator?

“No sir,” she replied looking first at his Bible and then to hers. “The sentence and structure are exactly the same in both.”

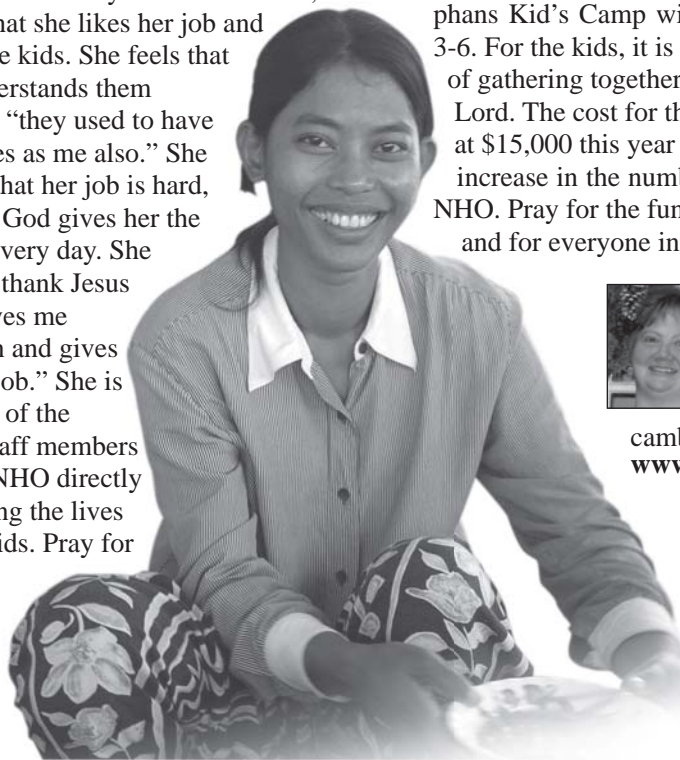

Second only to Jesus, I feel that the most important provision of New Hope for Orphans (NHO) is the caregivers. They are the ones who are sharing the joy, comforting the tears, teaching values and dispensing discipline as they raise the children. They do this as a result of their faith. I thought you would like to get to know one of them better.

Sreyna serves as a cook and caregiver at the Phnom Penh orphanage. She recently shared that, while living in the province of Siem Reap, she was seriously ill. She had no money to go to the hospital and could not find help. A Korean doctor from Phnom Penh found her. While helping her sickness, he shared the good news of Jesus with her. She says, "I decided to believe in Jesus on that time, because of the word of God touched me through him. After that, he sent me to a Phnom Penh hospital. I thought that Jesus made me a wonderful thing and opened the way for me through a Korean doctor." This was in 2003.

Many months later, she was better. The doctor asked her if she wanted to work and she said "yes", so he sent her to the Phnom Penh

orphanage to be a caregiver. She says that at first, she thought that she would never get used to the job. She didn't like it or the children but felt that she didn't have any other choice, so she stayed. After a while, she realized that she likes her job and loves the kids. She feels that she understands them because "they used to have hurt lives as me also." She admits that her job is hard, but that God gives her the power every day. She says, "I thank Jesus who saves me from sin and gives me the job." She is just one of the many staff members within NHO directly impacting the lives of the kids. Pray for

their provision, encouragement, strength, health and wisdom.

Also for prayer, plans are underway for Kid's Camp! The third New Hope for Orphans Kid's Camp will be held September 3-6. For the kids, it is a wonderful time of gathering together and worshipping the Lord. The cost for the camp is estimated at \$15,000 this year because of the large increase in the number of children within NHO. Pray for the funding, the planning and for everyone involved.

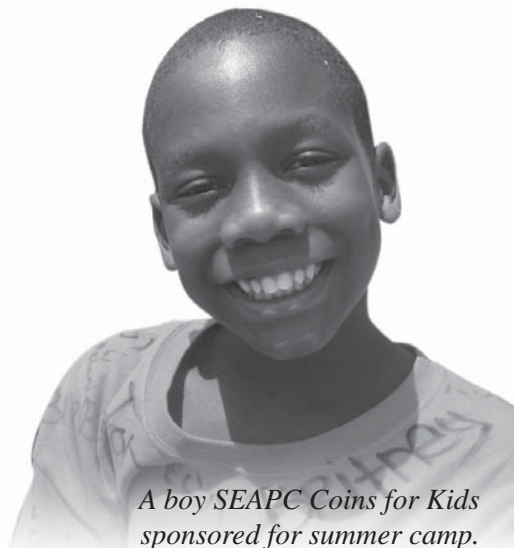

The books practically opened themselves to the page. There was the studious and the listener, the Grandma thinking of her far away family, the Sunday school teacher guarding the proper interpretation of the scriptures she knew so well. Again I swept the room with heart-felt thanks. Each of these people is an answer to many prayers. Each is following Jesus. Each is a member of a local church and giving themselves there. Each has found friendship and support in this group, and each supports SEAPC.

These are the people who give ten or twenty five or fifty dollars a month in undesignated funds. They pay the payroll, light the lights, rent the rooms that gives SEAPC a home. They pray for us and read this letter and rejoice with us at what God is doing through us in the earth. Focusing on one person at a time, I prayed a simple thank you to the Lord. The people of the Monday home Bible Study are this month's "answer to prayer."

We had a group of Taiwanese brothers and sisters come out to Tibet for the first time in their lives, taking the step of faith, as lambs among wolves. Two by two, led by the Holy Spirit, they walked through streets praising His Name. They entered welcoming villages, testifying His love, and they ministered in the hospital announcing His coming Kingdom.

You did not get to read or see any of that on the news. Indeed, the news only started reporting what happened right after the very day they left Tibet. You would have seen the repeated footage of the momentary chaos and heard the raucous over which horse or chariot to support. But you already know this is not a war of horses and chariots. Your prayers may have been unreported by mainstream media, but they have definitely not been unanswered by the one true God.

In April, we have seen how the Lord has brought Chinese Han Christians to us, committed to serving Tibetans in His name. Oh, it can only come by His Grace! Who would

have thought prayer walking in Taiwan would have opened up doors of cooperation with Christian doctors in Tianjin who want to come to Tibet?

Lift up Pastor Doctor Tung, Gail, Daniel and the Wangs in your prayers as we continue to seek His Will on expanding His Kingdom together in Tibet. Pray especially for Dr Keller, Rebekah Craig and myself as we seek access to Tibet to continue what the Lord has set before us.

We testify to His faithfulness. Some of you might still remember Wang Mo, a lovely young Tibetan girl who not only had a hole in the heart but also a brain tumor. We closed the hole in Beijing last year, and the brain tumor has been in remission without medical intervention. This family was having a breather when just last month, they discovered her younger sister Pao Mo also has a hole in the heart and a brain tumor.

Just today, I was in Anzhen Hospital with Matthew, whom Wang Mo remembers

fondly as “Big Nose.” I was there to hug Pao Mo. She is here to be treated as well. She asked fondly for the two Taiwanese sisters she met over a month ago back in Tibet – the “Balloons and Singing Sisters”. These are the Taiwanese sisters that came to the hospital and shared the message of Hope – the same sisters who told Pao Mo’s mother about this Kingdom that is near, that this God is faithful and that this God is real. The same sisters who sat and prayed with her over her family.

Today, her husband came up to me and said, “When my wife stepped off the train at Beijing station, she told me that Jesus is real.” I could only nod and say “Amen.”

The group became uncomfortable as the teacher began to unfold the mystery of his teaching. "In the power of the Holy Spirit," he began. "We enter the ministry arena prepared to 'do' first and to 'teach' second. If your ministry arena is a village, you will be asked to pray for the sick that live there. Trust the Holy Spirit to release healing to someone so that you may then 'teach' about Jesus.

"Can you tell me testimonies of places and times in which you had no idea what to teach, but you prayed for someone and God did something and it opened a door for you?"

One by one they gave testimony to witnessing the power of the Holy Spirit as He declared Himself to be present in the lives of those who lived in the villages. And they shared how easy it was to start the church in that village after the "doing." Among their favorite stories were those that included government leaders who had been healed, delivered or saved as the result of a divine action. They reveled in the fact that the entire communist government could not stop the power of God.

Relaxing, the teacher sat back and allowed them to teach each other through testimony. He heard of healings from blindness and of cripples being restored to complete health. They spoke of freedom from fear and things that make noise in the night. They spoke of healing from the trauma that all the war had brought to them. They talked of restoration of families that had been separated.

Most of all they talked about the things they were seeing Jesus do today. Their faith was so alive, their commitment so complete, that he began to wonder why the Lord had brought him there. Was it to teach or to learn? Had the Lord decided that he needed to hear real faith in action? How was he going to follow this? All eyes again turned to him. But, this time they were more friendly than curious.

"Thank you," he said. "I have now seen Jesus in action."

The group would spend five days in that room. They would sing very quietly for the building was being observed and when they could be heard on the street a brother began pounding on the side of a metal barge to cover their noise. Truth was shared with a great respect for teacher and student, and at the end of the five days, after a time of communion and prayer, they stole away into the night prepared to "do" and to "teach."

Please pray for the church in persecuted nations. They meet in homes and brush arbors or any safe place and their greatest message is the testimony of the Lord. We connect from time to time along the Me Kong, more to hear than to speak, more to learn than to teach. I shall never forget my first time in that room. The eyes, the faces, the lives compel me to keep on with the pace of Jesus.

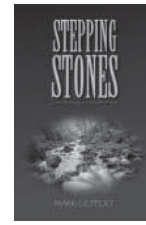

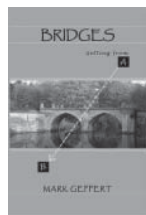

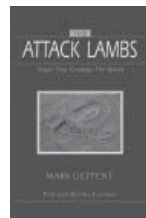

Then Peter said, “Silver or gold I do not have, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk.” Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man’s feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God.

How have you ever been healed? Who was it in your life that first told you about Jesus? What was the immediate thing in your life that changed when you prayed? I’m sure most of you have read or heard amazing stories of miraculous physical healing around the world. Some of you have actually experienced physical healing in your body as a result of prayer or know someone personally who has.

In my life I have heard many different things about healing from many different practices of faith. Some say that if you truly believe

than you will be healed and only those with real faith can receive miraculous healing. Others feel that if you pray certain prayers or give certain amounts of money then you will be healed.

I have even heard that healing within the body takes place at different rates that are decided by how much that person wants to release their sin. One theory that I have clung to over the years is that there is no real equation to the will of God.

I only know a few definites in this. The first definite is that miraculous physical healing really does take place. I have experienced it in my own life and have witnessed it in many others. Second, is that Jesus loves every person on earth exactly as much as the rest. Third, and the most important, is that healing (physical, mental, or spiritual) takes place every single time someone prays to believe in

Jesus. Sin is released and spiritual new growth begins.

Please be encouraged to walk through your town, like the man healed with Peter, and jump praising God for the healing in your life!! Then go in the confidence that Peter had and offer healing and Jesus to those around you.

One of our older friends in ministry called this week to tell us that his farm had at last sold. He had always said that when it did, he would make a substantial contribution for Tibet. He passed his gift to Ken who brought the check to the office. It arrived at the same time that three children were undergoing life-saving surgery in Beijing. I was able to call Matt at their bedside and tell him the money had come to pay the bill. Please pray that this will be our daily portion.
