It Takes a Team

It really wasn't much as rice fields go. A couple of lazy cows lay in the mid-morning heat, a bone-thin old yellow dog gave them wide berth as he led us to the only shade, a blighted Asian Oak right in the center of the 10 acres.

Tropical sun blazed down on our little team as we prayed over the land. We spoke the word of the Lord as long as we could take the heat and then, with camera running, we made our way down the central dyke and to the red dust lane that was the "main road."

"So, Brother Mark, what do you see?" Bill and I had journeyed thousands of miles and at least a decade together. We had walked through mountains and valleys praying for a breakthrough. Now he wanted to record what the Lord was going to do in this place.

"I see a University here, with a trade school and an orphanage. I see two thousand kids studying to be teachers and technicians, accountants and doctors. From these Killing Fields I see a resurrection that will produce a generation that will lead their beloved Cambodia from the bottom to the top. I see young evangelists going from here to the nations."

Shocked at the words coming out of my mouth, I stopped speaking. We had just committed SEAPC to a dream that any reasonable person would say was impossible. The oppression and poverty crushed in on us even as we made our declaration of faith.

"And how will that happen?"

"We will build a team of educators, intercessors, builders and believers who can get the job done." I had just finished John Maxwell's 17 principles of team building and had a ready answer.

Now, gazing from the second story window of the LITCO Center at Banteay Meancheay Christian University, I thought of all the people who had worked so hard for the announcement I was about to make. The dream is just a few steps from becoming reality. The graduating students of Rongko High School, deep in the province of Cambodia, were filing into the classroom to hear my congratulations on behalf of the team who, five years before, had dedicated themselves to the task of bringing Jesus to them through quality education.

SEAPC Cambodia

Prayer needs for Cambodia continue to include the funds for construction and teacher's salaries, discipleship of teachers and students, and the upcoming events in Cambodia (Friends Around the Table, NHO Kid's Camp, Rongko Teacher's Retreat). However, today, I feel led to tell you about two specific reasons to celebrate.

Ratt is a young man who arrived at the orphanage in Koh Kong in April 2005 with

two of his sisters. He was eleven years old at that time. In July of 2007, he decided that he did not want to comply with the orphanage guidelines and left.

Elva arrived at the orphanage in Phnom Penh in May 2004 (at age eight) with two brothers and a sister. A little over a year ago, she started to rebel and was transferred to another orphanage in an attempt to guide her into better decisions. Unfortunately, it did not work and she also left NHO in July 2007.

The reason for rejoicing is that both children have recently returned. What they meant as acts of rebellion, the Lord used to draw them back to Himself. Ratt talked about suddenly not being able to go to school and not having enough clothes or food. He remembered having these things at the orphanage and decided to return. Elva shared of having to labor in the rice fields and in a garment factory for ten or more hours a day, every day. She decided to return as she remembered how different life at the orphanage had been.

Both of these children received prayer through their previous sponsors (Ratt's sponsors were available to sponsor him again), their siblings and the staff at NHO. These unified prayers produced fruit in the changed hearts of these two youth.

Prayer Testimony

“Yes,” the superintendent said. “We can have the Cambodia flag and the Christian flag, side by side, in the new school yard because Jesus has given us the school.”

With that statement a man who had worshipped false gods, who had known the pain of the killing fields, who had been the principal who opened his school to the gospel, declared the answer to our greatest prayer. He would arrange for Christ to be lifted up with his nation to show the community that prosperity that comes with the name of Jesus. We started years ago with a meeting with the Secretary of State for Youth and Sports. We began to ask people to pray for the open door in Cambodia.

Following the direction of the Secretary we joined with this rural school principal to establish a relationship through which he would be healed, come to know the Lord, and open the way for 2,000 children to come to know the Lord. His influence staved off a teacher’s rebellion, persuaded the headman’s position and resulted in Ministry teams coming and sharing Christ with the students. It was this man who allowed the posting and praying of the Lord’s prayer and the organization of prayer meetings and Bible studies. This is the man who has been established as the Superintendent of Schools in the region of Rongko, in a nation whose constitution declares, the national religion of Cambodia is officially Buddhism.

How much prayer has been offered for him over the past five years? How does it work that the Lord establishes a key man in each place to hold the door open? How is it that Jesus knows the thoughts and intents of the heart and steers it in the direction He desires? These are all good questions, but they miss the point: Prayer, when offered, will be answered. God reaches to the hearts of key people and turns them as we pray. The moment requires the cooperation of many people in many lands. These are people who believe. These are people who are changing lives through their prayers.

Every month we are reminded to pray for workers, doors, finances and fruit. In the February 2008 newsletter, the “Pray for DOORS” section specifically asked us to pray for open doors in Tibet. As if a prophetic word, the following month it seemed that the doors had closed. However, the Word of the Lord has promised:

“Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you.” (Matthew 7:7)

I had the joy of spending May through July in China with the Touching Hearts team. You joined us in prayer, asking God to open the doors that appeared closed. In the meantime the work continued. Children received treatments and a demonstration of His Love. New workers offered their talents and gifts. A resident physician, part of the Beijing treatment team, became our brother in Christ and several others in the medical community heard the Gospel, some for the first time. One of our interpreters came down from Tibet and traveled with me for 3 weeks, assessing hospitals in small towns

and large cities of nearby Yunnan province. A doctor and nurse at a cardiology center generously blessed me with food, lodging and friendship in their homes for another 6 weeks. The Lord revealed Himself to those women in special ways.

While I traveled around Yunnan, the rest of the Tibet team traveled all around the globe, each one “about the Father’s business”, praising Him for the opportunities He provided. Then, finally, we received what we have all been asking for – the door opened again. We were allowed back into Tibet at the beginning of this month and all are excited about the days to come. On July 4th, while the U.S. celebrated Independence Day, Mark Geppert and I met with the hospital in Tibet to sign the memorandum of agreement for another season of service. Praise the Lord for holding open the door so we can continue sharing the true freedom that can only be found in Christ!

This rice field transformation had involved Cambodians, Singaporeans, Malaysians, Thais and Americans who prayed, gave, traveled, sweated, labored, taught, evangelized and prayed some more. It had taken 2,500 dump trucks of fill to bring the rice field to the dirt road level.

Montour Supply had made it possible to introduce a pre-school for four-year-olds, and the Church of Singapore Bukit Timah had taken over many of the incidental costs and sent three of her best young people to train the staff.

The Secretary of State had given us the government support we needed, and Jesus had healed and saved the public school principal. We were off and running. 1,500 more trucks of dirt lifted the existing school out of the flood plain, and a potable water well decimated the absentee problem.

Confidence in the program and the power of prayer lifted the staff from the lethargic malaise of subtropical poverty to the pinnacle of personal achievement. These 75 young people were about to graduate in a country in which 2.8% have completed sixth grade. This was a great day.

Turning from the window I looked at the product of a dream team. Each one had received Jesus during the youth outreaches. Each one was learning the Word of God from their recently born-again teachers.

"How many of you would like to continue your education?" I asked. 75 hands shot up.

"How many of you can afford to go to the University at the Capitol?" Not one hand was raised.

"I suppose we will have to open the Rongko Christian University then." Even as I said it, I felt the "Amen" of the Dream Team.

Finish the building, find six teachers and two administrators, get the paper work from the Secretary and be ready to go by October 1. Now does that sound too hard for the Lord? Not when you understand how far we have come by faith. Not when you understand that we are now 2,000 in our school and the University is just the natural extension of what the Lord has begun.

Have a dream? Build a Team. I thank God for each and every one who has prayed, given, gone and believed that in Christ all things are possible. Oh, and the cows? That calf now climbs up to the second floor and sleeps in one of the hallways. Abundance touches every part of a community being transformed by the visitation of God.

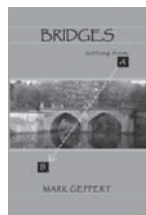

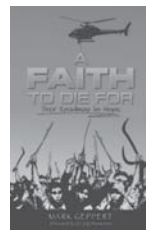

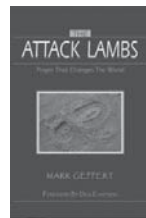

Our mud-covered minivan slid cautiously through the tracks of the tanker truck in front of us as we made our decent from fog-covered mountain top city of PhongSali. “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.” John 1:1-5, 14

I love to read about individuals who have lived or designed what we would term as successful lives. I love to read about rags to riches stories, people who have overcome great obstacles to conquer, and then to find success in business systems.

I have read a lot of success secret books from writers such as Zig Ziglar, Art Williams and John Maxwell to name a few. I learned along time ago if you want to be successful, go find someone who became successful, study how they became a success and model it.
