Life and Death

Ralph and Sandy Polehonki had just hosted a wonderful day of prayer and fellowship. Even though the University of Texas – El Paso – had lost a homecoming football game, it wasn't life or death. It had been decided in a "sudden death" overtime period so there was that same pallor that would cover Pittsburgh the following weekend.

The El Paso Sunday paper was delivered to their home that morning after and as I again tried to kill my flesh with a cup of yogurt, I glance through the feature stories in the religion section. I was amazed to find there an article highlighting the newest sect among the Hispanics, San Muerte - the Saint of Death.

It seems that many are beginning to worship this idol with a very large following in Chicago and among other Hispanic groups. The previous weekend, I had been with Hector Zetino in Little Rock Arkansas. It had been the Hispanics who had supported the Prayer Walk Seminar there and they were worshipping life, not death.

Now in the midst of a very large Hispanic population in South West Texas, I was shocked to find how established this cult had become. Thousands have joined in the prayers to San Muerte, the paper reported. The medium who serves the Chicago idol eluded, "It is a lot easier to contact San Muerte than to get free from him."

The thought of death holds brings with it many terrifying images. For the non Christian, death is an end, a cessation of the existence of the person. Perhaps they will have done good deeds so their ways will be carried into another generation, but their life has ended.

For the Christian, there is no death. We will all cease to function physiologically, but Jesus has given us eternal spiritual life. He has come that we may have life and that more abundantly. On the day we made Jesus Lord of our lives, we died to ourselves. Buried with Him in baptism, we are also raised with Him in newness of life. The old person, appointed to death, has died and the new person has emerged.

Three deaths this month have deeply touched my heart.

My desk has been overflowing with paperwork. As a result from the Choir's tour, we now have at least 50 new sponsorships. Within the last month, over 22 new children have come to the orphanages. I must tell new sponsors that there is a waiting period before receiving their child's data, and I need to prepare the sponsorship packets when information comes. Please do not misunderstand me. I enjoy this type of paperwork. I am filled with much joy every time I see a new sponsor or look at the photos of new children because I know that the child's life is forever changed in a positive way. Here are a couple of examples.

Rina is a 10-year-old who arrived at the Kampong Cham orphanage on September 30 with his two brothers. His father died from disease and his mother is rumored to have HIV. A couple of years ago, Rina injured himself while playing with a sling-shot and lost sight in one eye. Because the family could not take him to a doctor, the sight in his other eye has also been lost. He was verbally abused because of this. He is happy to be at the orphanage.

His new sponsors are prayer warriors who will pray for him continually. He will be tested to see if anything can be done to help his vision.

Nary, age 6, and Snanita, age 8, came to Kampong Cham on September 28. Their father went to Phnom Penh to work and has not returned for several years. Their mother also abandoned them. They were living with their grandparents who can not always get enough food to eat because of illness. Snanita said, "Now I am so excited about coming to live in the orphanage, I love it here so much. Jesus is my helper. I will obey Him." Snanita's new sponsor is an 8 year old girl in Florida. It will be fun to see what will happen as the two girls – sisters through the bond of sponsorship – grow up.

Finally, I want to share some great news with you. Boeurn has told us that he and Vanna are expecting their first child. I am so happy for them. It is wonderful to see the Lord blessing them in this way. Please pray for them during this time of expectation. I know that they will be very thankful for your prayers.

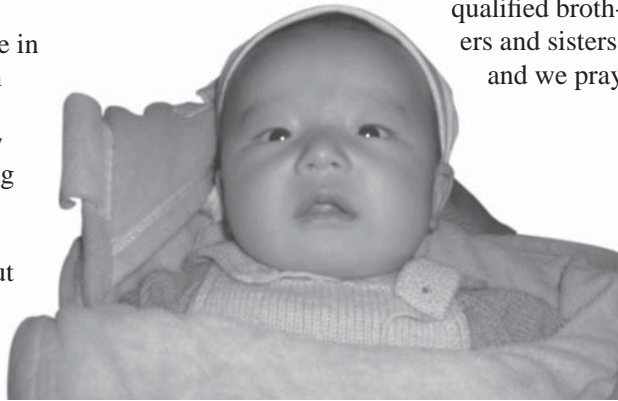
Hello! Lawrence here writing from Lhasa, Tibet. Thank you for all your prayers. Prayers have been what have kept us going despite the seemingly unsurmountable obstacles. Through your prayers, the Lord has been graciously true to His word, letting no one shut doors He has opened. October sees us resume sending our Tibetan children to Beijing for treatment. These kids invariably are the ones that need urgent and more complicated surgeries.

We have a wonderful man of God, David Fu at Beijing, that travels and waits at the train station and airport to welcome our kids and families with open arms — a stranger to our families only in name. Matt was in Beijing to spend time with these kids and families. Our kids have met Matthew in the past, and it is difficult for a Tibetan to forget about that big nose he carries around.

Matt and I had a pretty intense time in Lhasa. In less than a week, over an average of four meetings from morning til late, we witnessed how indeed the Lord has been answering our prayers for more workers. He reaffirms on His intention to have this project truly expand throughout the whole of Tibet, touching the hearts of kids and families. This coming November, Mark, Matt and a team will come back to

Lhasa, Tibet. Please remember us in your prayers as we strive to fulfill His intention. We will be meeting with Hospital director Wang, her team and the various potential new workers from around Tibet. We are working on starting the training for new workers this time in November, with the purchase of the new portable ultrasound diagnostic laptop and, more importantly, establish the network of support, care and follow up for our kids and families in their hometowns.

This November, Mark will be at my church in Malaysia, involving himself in the English service camp. As Mark travels around, pray that he will continue to raise workers from around the world who have a calling for the various ministries SEAPC is involved in. For Tibet, visa requirements are getting stricter, but we trust that the Lord will call upon the masses of eminently qualified brothers and sisters, and we pray

that they will hear His voice and be touched to come here and touch hearts for Him. Yes, indeed, it can be tough at times, leaving home and family. Personally, it has been quite a struggle, but we have a good bunch of brothers and sisters here providing support for each other. Our numbers here are few, but our Lord is great. This Refiner's Fire has been such a blessing for me, and I urge you to talk to Matt or Mark about the possibilities of being part of this ministry.

It costs right now about \$3500 per child for treatment and transport at Beijing. We want to continue sending about four kids per week to Beijing until the first week of December, as the conditions are favorable in terms of transport, availability of medical resources and weather. Finances have been in our prayers, the total sums are big, and daily I am amazed at how we can come up with them, at just the right time, to fulfill the needs that are at hand.

When we began in missions there were two great walls dividing the world into "Closed Countries," "Limited Access Countries," and "Open Countries." We talked of two curtains that kept the bulk of the world behind either the "Iron" or the "Bamboo" curtains.

It was during that time that we were called to go to the nations and pray for open doors. In fact a wonderful ministry, "Open Doors" was already carrying Bibles beyond both curtains into Russia and China.

As millions were mobilized in prayer, the Lord raised the first curtain. He opened the USSR by bringing down not only the

physical Berlin Wall, but also the spiritual wall of communist atheistic darkness. And we learned of very strong churches in Siberia and Poland.

The Iron Curtain was raised so people could go in, the Bamboo Curtain was raised so people could go out to the nations.

Now, we must pray that the veil of the false prophet be pulled back, that the full face of Islam be revealed for what it is. The Moslem Millions must know of a Father who lives in heaven and His Son, Jesus.

Agatha Chan, our very dear friend and benefactor has passed away. Her last breath in this life was spent on October 6 as she slept. Agatha has been a very important part of our personal lives. When I was nearly martyred in 1999 it was Agatha who helped me get my nerve back. She, like my wife, would not let me back away from the calling on my life; but insisted that I press on in the Lord.

We shared many adventures. It was Agatha who called and said the Lord had shown her that we were to travel to China in the midst of the SARS epidemic and go to the very place from which SARS had come and to do spiritual warfare on behalf of the nations impacted by the virus. She arranged the trip and we went and there were no more SARS related deaths from that day. It was Agatha who called together major donors to sponsor the Cath Lab resulting in more than a half million dollars in contributions. She bore in her heart the needs of the children.

The second death was a little Tibetan boy who had leukemia. He lived in our hearts. Prayer was summoned around the world. He suffered the amputation of one leg in an attempt to stop the spread of the disease, but to no avail, and he died. He had received Jesus as had his family, but they are devastated in their loss. We weep over a child's death because it seems so unjust. All the prayer and the best efforts could not keep him with us.

The third death this month has stirred my heart to action. This baby was born with heart disease. I was told that this condition must be treated within 60 days or the child

would die. With treatment she could have lived a healthy and normal life.

The family took her to the Lama who did not feel that the timing was right for her to be taken for treatment. They delayed more than a month, but when the child did not improve with the Lama's incantations, they began to search for medical help. They first went to the #2 Tibetan Hospital where they were told after more than a week that nothing could be done. They brought the child to our project. They had no money and it had been 56 days since birth. We of course paid the way and sent the child with the mother to Beijing for treatment. She died in her mothers arms aboard the plane.

I know there are 9,000 children out there. They have a timebomb ticking in their hearts. They will die by age 10 if they are not found and treated. I live every day of my life with this knowledge. A child can live for \$1,000 — a normal and Christ-centered life for \$85 a month. We need our equipment to be installed, money to buy the devices that close the holes and the technology to go out and find these children.

Death cuts away the pleasant thoughts, the reasons for self indulgence. Death is that time of reckoning for each of us. What are we doing with the life Jesus has given us? You and I can together defeat death in the lives of 9,000 children. As thousands begin to worship Saint Death, we will worship the One who gives life with our offerings.

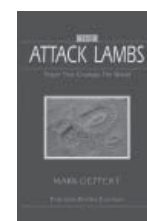

Genesis 35:3, “And let us arise, and go up to Bethel; and I will make there an altar unto God, who answered me in the day of my distress, and was with me in the way which I went. And they gave unto Jacob all the strange gods which were in their hand, and all their earrings which were in their ears; and Jacob hid them under the oak which was by Shechem. And they journeyed: and the terror of God was upon the cities that were round about them, and they did not pursue after the sons of Jacob.”

Those of us deeply involved in the South East Asia Prayer Center, specifically our project in Tibet, use a very simple acronym — HEART — to approach our daily tasks:

- He owns it all
- Everyday is an opportunity
- Action must be taken
- Remember to count your Blessings
- Thank Him

Often times we face hardships in those daily events and search for explanations

or simple resolutions. Last month I found a 54-day-old child in Lhasa and prayerfully made the arrangements to send this child to Beijing for emergency care. I was given the facts that if this child would not live to 60 days. He had already been turned away for treatment at another hospital and the parents knew that survival would be difficult. This child was struggling as his two major arteries flowing into the heart had been reversed and only because of the large holes within his heart was he still alive.

Despite incredible efforts, this child never made it through the flight to Beijing or to the operating table. His parents are deeply touched by the rapid efforts we made and are

grateful for the attempts but it has proven to be an extremely trying month for my team.

We are currently sending 4-6 families for treatment per week (those children who need the most critical care); this work continues through the Lord’s ultimate grace, and we will again arrive in Lhasa, Tibet on November 10 to finalize a ten-year extension within Tibet. Personally, like Jacob in the passage above, I have just come through a very unexpected and trying time within the daily works of this task, but I am remembering to praise God for His answers in times of distress for I know that, as we go back into the city, His power goes before us and His strength is ultimate.

Please agree with me this month that every place we go and every action we take is an opportunity to honor God and take time to praise Him for the privilege we have in walking with Him.

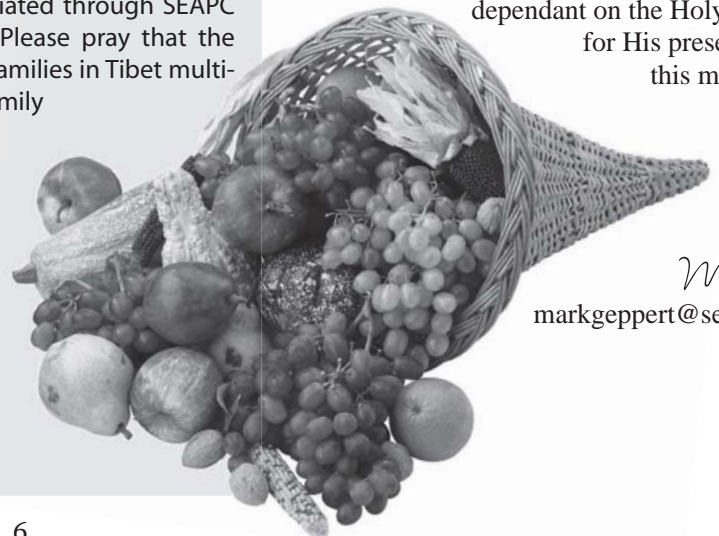

Do not pass go — do not collect \$200 (for those of us who've played Monopoly). Jesus said to go and don't bother about taking stuff with you (Luke 10:4). I know not to pack too much. I tell people that going on short term teams not to pack too much all the time. There are so many things to take care of when you go on a trip. Women especially often wonder if the effort will be worth it.

It took me an hour and a half to make a 40 minute trip leaving me with 30 minutes to park in extended parking (row 16!), carry my heavy suitcase that had to be checked in at the desk (yes, I overpacked and shouldn't even have had a bag that large for a 4-night trip), go through security and get to the gate. They waited for me and knew my name as I went through the gate after the smiling woman from check-in followed me to give me the computer bag I had left behind. I was reminded by the stewardess' announcement that I was en route for 4 hours to a plane change in Las Vegas. It's going to be a good flight.

My luggage did arrive with me in San Jose, and I was on my way with Matt, Mark and Tim to meet Sharon Anderson, VP of Student Development and Enrollment at Bethany University Santa Cruz, and Jennifer Madigan, Associate Professor of Special Education at San Jose University. They are going to help using their expert skills of University development and curriculum writing in our Cambodia College in Banteay Meanchey. Then I got to catch up with Matt and Jessica and our board members David and Merreyl Whitney. Friday was sightseeing in San Francisco and the opening mission conference night at River of Life Christian Church in San Jose where Mark was the speaker.

It was a high yield conference bearing

many new "Go" thinkers and doers. The Lord always wants to move people from A to B when He invites Mark. This was a mission conference, but Mark actually does a seminar called "Bridges" that identifies the throughways and builds in the team dynamic to enable us to serve the Lord to our maximum potential. This will give us the safety net to get the purpose accomplished and not land in jail like they do in Monopoly. At SEAPC we love getting from project start to finish without any long delays and, if not, then without ruffled feathers. That is not always the case. Your personal participation with us is the only way we can.

I'm back in Pittsburgh now which is P instead of B, but I'm sure the Lord is pleased. It was indeed worth the effort! Write me if you want to be on the team — it will be worth your effort.

If God tells you to go, by all means go. But, if you stay, then you pay. Fair enough.

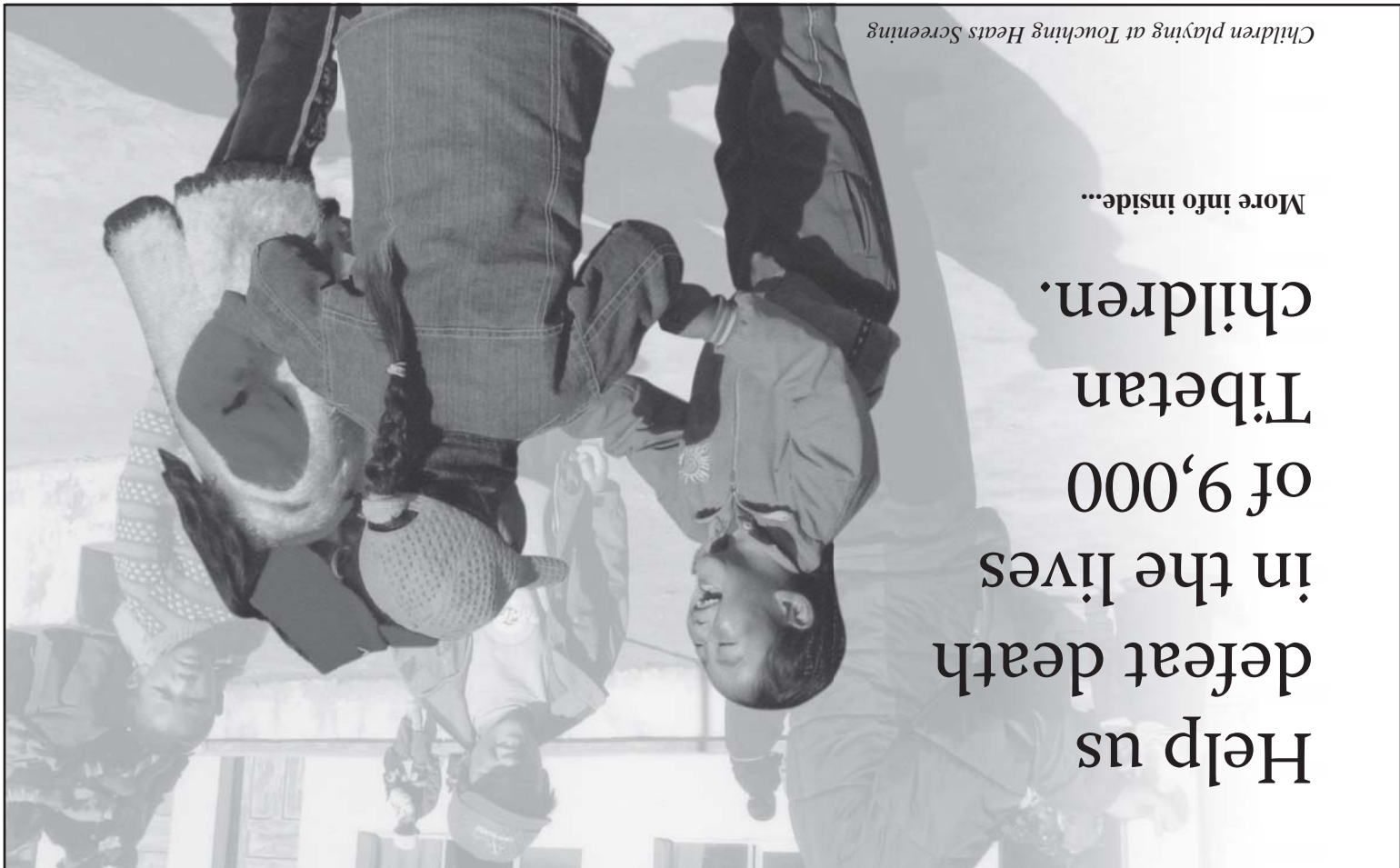
The amount of money they had with them was about 11 million in gold alone. These were people who had lived in captivity for 70 years. Even in their bondage, the Lord had caused them to prosper.
